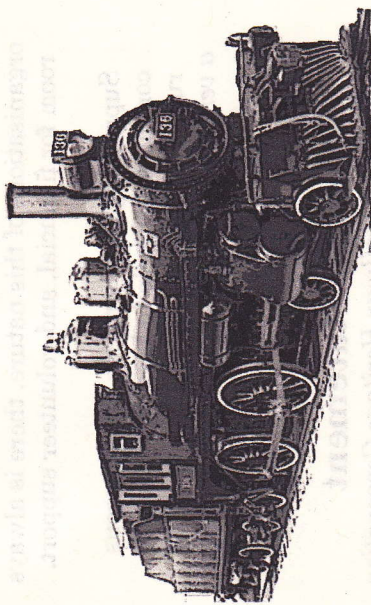

How To Get Here

The South Simcoe Railway is located in
downtown Tottenham Ontario, 4 km north of
Hwy #9.

From Highway 400, take Highway 9 west 20 km
to the traffic light at the Tottenham Road (County
Rd. 10), turn right (north) to the second street
north of the Mill St. intersection.

Turn left onto Sullivan Dr. and proceed west two
short blocks into the Railway service entrance and
yard.

South Simcoe Railway

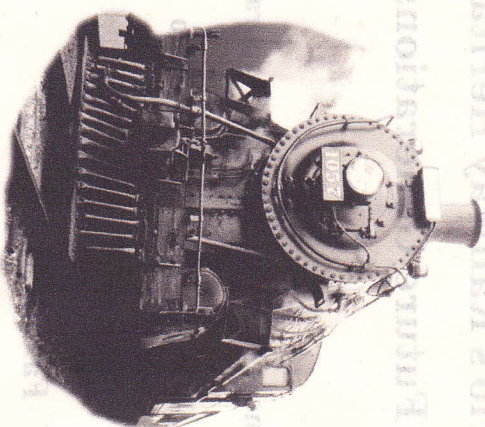
The South Simcoe Railway is a shortline railway owned and operated by the South Simcoe Railway Heritage Corporation, a not-for-profit volunteer historical organisation.

• About The South Simcoe Railway •

With the completion of the Canadian Pacific Railway in 1885, Canada was finally joined from the east, to the west coast. The driving of the "Last Spike" was an historical event, and the beginning of transcontinental travel overland by rail.

In the mid 70s, a group of concerned people began to gather equipment for preservation, as it was obvious that steam was no longer being used and at this late stage, anything left over, was to be scrapped. The intention was to create an operating railway using the collection.

The *South Simcoe Railway* name came into being with the relocation of the equipment, in 1986, to Tottenham, Ontario, our present home.

After much work, the right of way and equipment was made ready to work as a railway. The first official trips were made in July of 1992 and have continued to this day on a regular basis.

The first twenty years saw the South Simcoe Railway bring more than half a million visitors to ride between Tottenham and Beeton.
